A Message from Bebe Walton, lay leader: ARUMC Conference Update

You might ask what is Annual Conference (AC). This is where all the churches in Arkansas come together to conduct the business of the church. The event takes place over three days and much was discussed, decided and voted upon. As the lay leader for our church, I represent our church as a voting delegate to the AC. With two licensed/ordained pastors in this church (Pastor Sara & Pastor Brent [Pastor Jarod and Pastor Kathy's ordinations are with the Mississippi conferencel) we had two laitv of which David Martin was the second delegate. Jo Roberts was an 'at large' delegate (AC has a one pastor to one laity delegate ratio, since retired pastors also have voting rights but no church, 'at large' laity are needed to equalize the votes for pastor to laity ratio). AC is needed to keep the business of the church current with the times. We passed a budget of \$5,993,979.00 which is a 15% reduction from last year. The funds for the

conference come from the tithes of each church in the conference.

We voted on the clergy and laity delegates to Jurisdictional conference. This year it will be held in Rogers, Arkansas. We voted on a "re-affiliation policy." This was developed for those congregations who disaffiliated last year and have expressed a desire to return to the United Methodist denomination. We approved this policy.

We heard multiple reports from the various organizations and colleges of the church. It was good to hear that they are doing great work.

It was a great honor to represent our church at annual conference. This is a synopsis of the work that was done at this year's annual conference. I am happy to discuss in detail more of the work done at AC with anyone interested in hearing more.






