UPCOMING SERMON SERIES



Read 6:25pm.



A lot of us grew up with "Red Letter Bibles." These Bibles have all the words that Jesus said printed in red. Jesus' words stand out on the pages, drawing your eyes and mind to them as if to say, "Read this! These words are important!" Of course Jesus said a lot of things: he spoke to his disciples, he spoke to crowds gathered to learn from him, and he spoke to people who were anxious, grieving, and suffering. He spoke words of comfort. He spoke words of challenge. These words he spoke over 2,000 years ago continue to capture our attention and our hearts, they continue to inspire and convict. During the season of Lent, our sermon series is going to explore some of the specific "red letters" of Jesus and how we can take them more seriously in our lives today. We'll look at these red letters: Be Anxious for Nothing, The First Shall Be Last, Become a Servant, Deny Yourself and Follow Me, I Go to Prepare a Place for You, The Stones Would Shout, Do Not Be Afraid

YOUTH UPDATE: LOCKOUT EDITION BY STEVEN CARR


