

ADVENT CONSPIRACY: "GIVE YOUR PRESENCE ...CE NOT TS"

Many church members have attended the Advent Conspiracy class led by Pastor Annie and Jo Roberts. All have enjoyed it and many have a new thought or perspective on what they are giving for Christmas this year.

It appeared that several had already planned on changing their giving even before the book, Advent Conspiracy was introduced, but more in the class are thinking seriously about how they might be "making Christmas more meaningful (again)."

One of the stories that really touched one of the attendees was the story of a grandmother who was going to be unable to be with her family at Christmas. Her granddaughters came up with the idea of filling a mason jar with memories they had written on 52 little strips of paper. The grandma was to take one out randomly each week, on the same day of the week. Several of us teared up at the thought of the grandmother doing this and we all understood when she said it was her favorite day of the week.

Not only was it a special time for grandma, but a "time of worship too. God was making this connection between generations vibrant, with a mason jar full of construction paper. With this gift, a distance between loved ones was, in some ways, closed."

As we come to this Advent season let us each remember that like Jesus, who gave His all, we should take the time to give someone the gift that matters most, your "presence" and not your "presents".

I'm wondering how many will take the time and the effort to make someone "special" to them a mason jar filled with little memories?

How many of you will reach out to a family that is unable to give their children anything because they're struggling to even feed them or provide a warm place for them to live in this Advent season? Reach out anonymously and let them see that you are a child of God and celebrate Christmas by serving others as God would do.
